Farhiya Mohamed is the winner of this year's Joel Ayite Ajavon Scholarship of \$2,000. Farhiya graduated from Wilson High School and is now a freshman at St. John Fisher College, majoring in Biology.

Farhiya was born in Somalia and her family moved to Kenya before immigrating to America. She is from a large family and was required to assume significant family responsibilities while maintaining excellent academics and contributing to her school and community.

A participant in the International Baccalaureate program, Farhiya graduated with an unweighted cumulative GPA of 4.04 (on a 4.0 scale). Her community service included:

Muslim Youth Group: 3 years Teaching within the Somali community: 1 year

Unity Hospital Volunteer: 1 year MCC Autism Walk

Her school activities included three years of Math League, two years of Outdoor Club and two years of varsity golf. She was a member of the National Honor Society and received an Urban Black Scholar Award.

On her application, a teacher and program director wrote, "Farhiya's leadership style is powerful because it comes from a well-developed moral sense. I have had the pleasure of having Farhiya in a philosophy class, and her input into discussions often swayed many students into thinking about the common good. Outside of school, Farhiya has worked diligently facilitating understanding of the Muslim community. Quite simply Farhiya is a very strong informal leader. She is very approachable."



2018 FALL FOLIAGE TOUR

with Tech Talk by Mike Miller

The 2018 Fall Foliage Tour got off to a rocky start. Initially, we planned to meet at a bakery in Victor that we had used before as a meeting point for previous drives. However, I was informed that the bakery had been closed and replaced with a car wash. While that would have facilitated clean cars at the start of the drive, it wasn't quite the beginning I was looking for. So we moved the start point to the Apple Farm in Victor. Except I was then informed that the Apple Farm had burned to the ground the previous year! Sure enough, when I visited to check out the location, there was a backhoe digging up scorched earth that was still smouldering and the storefront had moved to a new building. Nonetheless, the owners assured me that they would be ready for us when we arrived in early October.

Through the efforts of GVC member Scott Brown, we had a special treat for this year's tour. At the end of the drive we would have a question-and-answer talk by Mike Miller, the

Chief Technical Editor for the Roundel. Mike drove his Dinan-prepped e46 325iC up from his home in Pennsylvania the Friday before the Tour, and did the drive with us on Saturday.

We met up at the Apple Farm and were welcomed by friendly staff, but also with gray skies and intermittent rain, with more rain forecast for the morning. After enjoying coffee and apple fry cakes, 17 cars set out at a relaxed pace with Mike Miller driving the lead car while I navigated the back roads that would take us down through the Finger Lakes, meandering between Honeoye and Canandaigua Lakes, until we reached Naples. From Naples we headed west until we reached Wayland and turned north to run along Hemlock Lake. Along the way the sun came out and the drive finished up in sunshine and alorious fall colors. We headed north until we reached Lima, at which point we hopped on I-390 and drove north to The Little Speed Shop in Rochester, who hosted Mike Miller's talk.

Mike writes the monthly Tech Talk column in the Roundel, answering questions that are submitted by club members via email. In addition to publishing selected questions every month in his column, Mike answers every email he receives, which can run to 30 per day. Mike represents an amazing resource for club members, and he was a hit with all who attended his talk.

Also a big thanks to Kevin and Jill Van Valkenburgh, owners of The Little Speed Shop, for hosting our event.





GVC'S 100TH

ULTIMATE HIGH-PERFORMANCE DRIVING SCHOOL AT WATKINS GLEN

On the weekend of September 22, the Genesee Valley Chapter (GVC) of BMW CCA hosted our 100th high performance driver education (HPDE) school at Watkins Glen International Raceway. We were graced with beautiful weather, great cars, great drivers, and a wonderful weekend driving the historic racetrack.

This event was co-sponsored by the Boston Chapter of BMW CCA, and the weekend was completely sold out with over 130 students and 100 instructors. GVC Chief Driving Instructor Bill O'Neill and his co-conspirators Dave Lanni, Adrienne Hughes, and Jeffery Gabel, were joined by Boston Chapter president and DE director Simon Cooper and Co-Chief Driving Instructor







Andy Thayer. The full run groups provided many fun passing opportunities and high camaraderie in the paddock.

While our schools attract a wide selection of cars from a variety of marques, the majority were BMWs of various vintages, including recent M cars like the F82 M4, E92 M3, and E82 1M, middle-age models such as the E46, and elderly Bimmers like the E30 M3 and the venerable E10 2002, which were the cars of choice at our earliest track schools in the late '80s. One of the favorite track cars of the moment is the E36 M3 manufactured from 1994-1999. They were out in force for the 100th event, with 18 participating in an impromptu group photo (see cover).

Saturday evening GVC hosted a special banquet in the Jack Daniel's Glen Club to commemorate the 100th driving school. It's hard to imagine that first GVC school weekend 35 years ago, the first of its kind at the re-opened track

emerging from bankruptcy in 1984. Driving School Co-Director Dave Lanni regaled us with stories of these early track days, beginning just two years after the chapter was founded. It got started in the early 1980's when GVC members started participating in driving schools at Lime Rock Park in Connecticut and Mosport in Canada.

GVC member Stan Parker, proposed to the Board of Corning Glass (the new owners of Watkins Glen) that GVC might host such a school at the Glen. GVC proceeded to rent the track for that inaugural HPDE, but then had to find instructors. Joe Ajavon recruited Bill Kane of the Patroon Chapter to help organize some of the early BMW CCA driving schools, and Bill became Chief Instructor at the inaugural school in the fall of 1984. Charlie Goodman from the Trillium Chapter of BMW Clubs Canada, who, along with Derek Hanson, was running Driving

Schools at Mosport, was also recruited. Charlie served as Chief Instructor, and shepherded the GVC schools for quite a few of the following years, ultimately turning the reins over to Stan Parker. Derek Hanson provided classroom instruction, and Charlie and Derek brought along many Trillium instructors to help GVC get rolling. The Canadians under Charlie and Derek ran excellent programs that established the high standard of professionalism and safety that GVC incorporates to this day. GVC provided instructors including Stan Parker, Bill O'Neill, David Lanni, Patti Perkins, Gene Skic, Mario DeFrancisco, and Gordie Britton, while Joe Ajavon ran the activities in the pits. They were soon joined by a cadre of instructors mainly from other NA region BMW CCA chapters such as New Jersey, Boston, Connecticut Valley, Patroon, New York, and Delaware Valley. Charlie Goodman organized one of the first formal Instructor Training Schools that was attended by GVC members. Continued on page 32...

















The curriculum for this course inspired GVC to offer its first formal Instructor Training School in the early 2000's, which evolved into the current officially sanctioned BMW CCA ITS.

One of the students in that first driving school in 1984 was Jim Dresser, who has been the registrar for all the GVC schools since 1985, as well as an instructor. Back in the day, everything was hard copy. Jim was one of the first GVC board members with a computer (there was no web in those days). Jim handled all the registrations (submitted by snail-mail); helped create and print the rosters, car numbers, track schedules, course descriptions and maps; sent out welcome letters to both students and instructors; and, along with a few hardy GVC volunteers, would stuff and label over 200 packets the night before each event.

Nowadays of course we have a GVC website (directed by Jim Dresser), online registration and Continued on page 35...

tracking through MotorsportReg.com, and a highly organized system for running the HPDE. But some things remain the same. The events are run by dedicated volunteers who go to great lengths to ensure that students have a safe and fun weekend exercising their Bimmers. So, as we celebrate the past 100 GVC Ultimate Driving Schools, we look forward to the next 100 at Watkins Glen, a track rich in American sports car racing history, and for the last 34 years, an integral part of our chapter's life story.


